- ⇒ Area is open from sunrise to sunset.
- ⇒ Please remember to carry out what you bring in.

## Nearby Attractions & Other Town Trails

**Coventry Village:** Main Street. A historic area of impressive architectural and natural beauty, featuring many retail and restaurant opportunities.

**Veteran's Memorial Park:** Corner of High & Lake Streets. Check out the State of CT's Vietnam Memorial, along with other war memorials and statues relevant to Coventry.

**Patriots Park:** Lake Street. Has a variety of amenities such as a playscape, waterfront, sports courts, picnic areas & shelter.

**Patriots Park Woods Trail:** Cross Street

**Riverview Trail:** Riverview Dr. & Merrow Rd.

**Creaser Park Trails:** Case Road

**Hop River Trail:** Hop River & Kings Roads

**Nathan Hale State Forest:** South Street

**Elizabeth Couch Preserve:** Root Road

**Nathan Hale Homestead & Strong Porter House:** South Street

## About The Trail...

- ⇒ Mill Brook Park was purchased by the Town in June 2004 from the Coutu Family who owned the property since 1945. The site was a wood lot since the incorporation of the Town and was owned by a succession of mill owners including the Porters, the Boyntons and the Tracys.
- ⇒ It is part of the Mill Brook Greenway system which extends North & South. Length of the trail is approx. .35 miles long.
- ⇒ Financial assistance was provided by the CT DEP Open Space and Watershed Land Acquisition Grant Program.
- ⇒ Mill Brook Park is a terrific place for families to enjoy beautiful scenery, picnics, or a quiet place to read in nature. There is a large area for children to play and a wide variety of wildlife to see and photograph.
- ⇒ Free parking is available on behind the Visitors Center. You can enter the park on Monument Hill or on Main Street near Ackert Hall.
- ⇒ Once you have walked the trail you will exit on Mason Street. Go right, and you can go back to the park by walking Wall Street and viewing the majestic older houses. If you go left, take Main Street and do some shopping or enjoy a meal at one of several fine restaurants in the Coventry Village.
- ⇒ If you're feeling adventurous you can continue up Main Street back to Monument Hill and follow the paved walk to the Veterans Memorial Green, and Patriots Park & Patriots Park Woods to enjoy some more history and recreational opportunities.
